

MODALITIES OF PARTICIPATION

Session modalities

Sessions will start and end punctually at the times indicated in the programme. During all sessions, except for the plenary sessions on 27 and 29 November, there are expected to be Q&A segments.

Session moderators will be responsible for ensuring participation from the floor and for facilitating multi-stakeholder dialogue. Participants wishing to speak from the floor should raise their hand, or country plate for State delegations. If given the floor, participants should clearly indicate their name and organization and keep their comments short (less than 2 minutes).

Constructive and respectful dialogue

All participants are encouraged to contribute to the Forum's spirit of constructive, multi-stakeholder dialogue, keeping a focus on finding solutions and ways to strengthen human rights protection and prevent and address harm.

Participants are requested not to read from pre-prepared written statements, documents or published texts in order to stimulate dynamic discussions. Written submissions may be sent to the Forum Secretariat for online posting (to: <u>forumbhr@ohchr.org</u>, indicating "Written submission" in the subject line).

Session moderators will use their discretion in managing interventions from the floor in order to enable different stakeholders to participate in the dialogue and to ensure a balanced debate, pertinent to the topic of the respective session (see guidance for session organisers and moderators).

In line with the nature of the Forum all stakeholders, States, non-governmental organizations, community representatives, and business participate on an equal footing.

Seating arrangements

There will be free seating in all sessions. Participants are advised to be in the room 10 minutes before the start of the session.

Languages

Interpretation is available in all UN languages for the plenary session on 27 November, and in English, French and Spanish for the plenary session on 29 November and a number of parallel sessions. Chinese interpretation is also available for one parallel session. Full information on available language interpretation will be posted on the Forum web page the week before the Forum.
