

Responses to the sociological survey of the UN Special Rapporteur on Extreme Poverty and Human Rights

1.1. 1.b (Development of relevant skills and international cooperation to strengthen the ability of low-income countries to use domestic resources) and 1.c (increased financial support to low-income countries);

1.2. Given the compliance with the main objectives of the fund being established, the items on inter-agency coordination in paragraph "a" and the provision of financial support to low-income countries in paragraph "c" should be considered a top priority;

2.1. Given the similarity of activities, it is possible to establish cooperation with these organizations;

2.2. Introduce possible incentives to create a competitive environment among the organizations involved;

3.1. Financial resources can be mobilized by publicizing the current situation in low-income countries;

3.2. Create a control mechanism to prevent tax evasion by organizations;

4.1. Create local institutions for low-income countries and monitor the organization and implementation of social protection;

4.2. Funds allocated for the purpose of creating social protection bases are to be financed in the form of a grant within the amount to be determined in relation to the GFSP budget, and in the form of a loan if this limit is exceeded;

4.3. Financial support does not need to be continuous for low-income countries;

4.4. The conditions for countries to receive financial support are to be implemented by mutual agreement;

4.5. The conditions to be determined should be harmonized based on the principles of ownership existing in the country;

5.1. It is not deemed expedient to discuss tax and other policy issues at the Global Fund for Social Protection. Nevertheless, carbon tax could be effective in further improving the Fund's financial capacity;

6.1. Implement activities in accordance with the ILO Recommendation No. 204 of 2015 concerning the Transition from the Informal to the Formal Economy, and social protection should cover the population working in the informal economy;

7.1. Establish cooperation with private insurance companies to prevent risks that may arise;

8.1. Determine the form of governance by a vote of the members of the Fund;

8.2. At the same time, the powers of governments, international organizations or social partners should be determined by the members of the fund through a vote;

8.3. Provide assistance in the treatment of the mentioned diseases.
